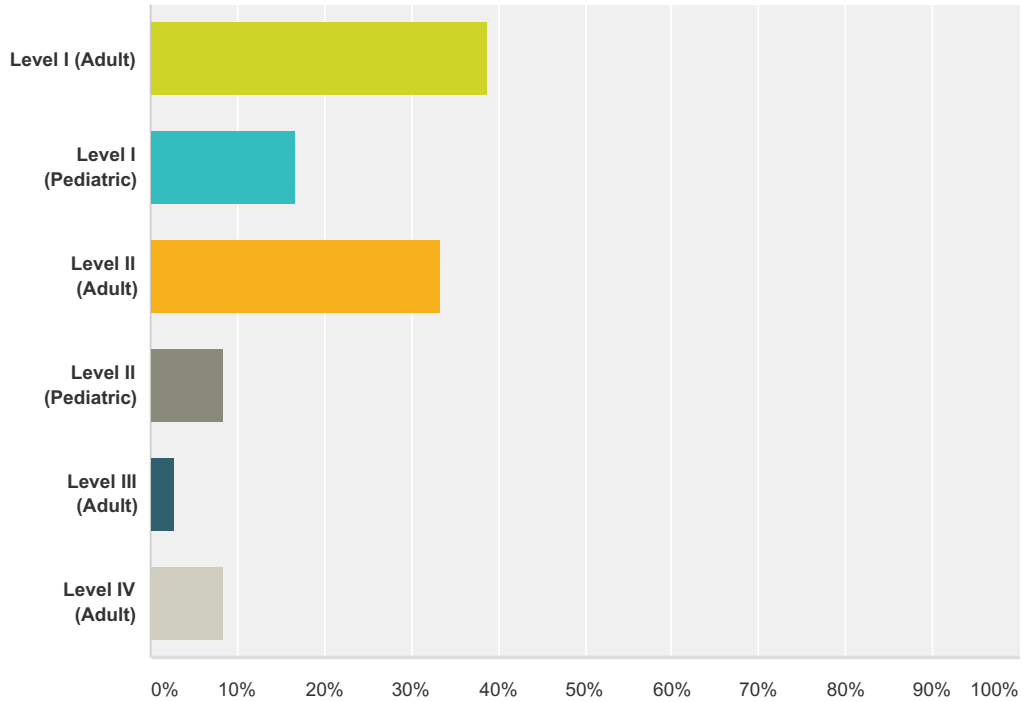

**Q1 Choose the level/type of trauma program where you work (you may select more than one option).**

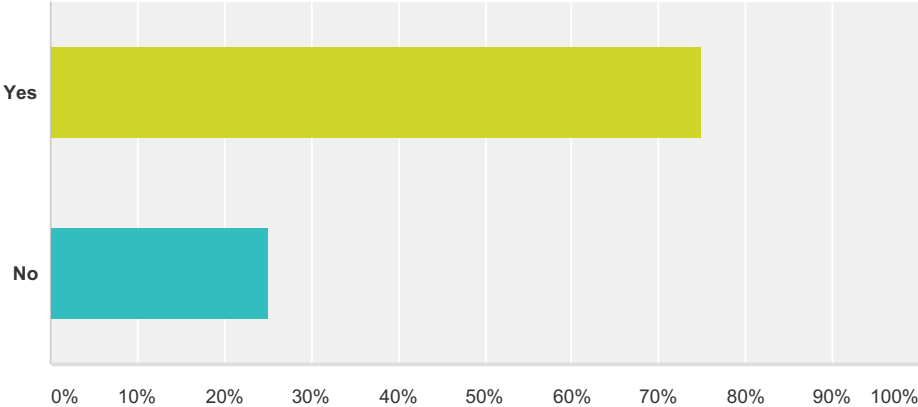

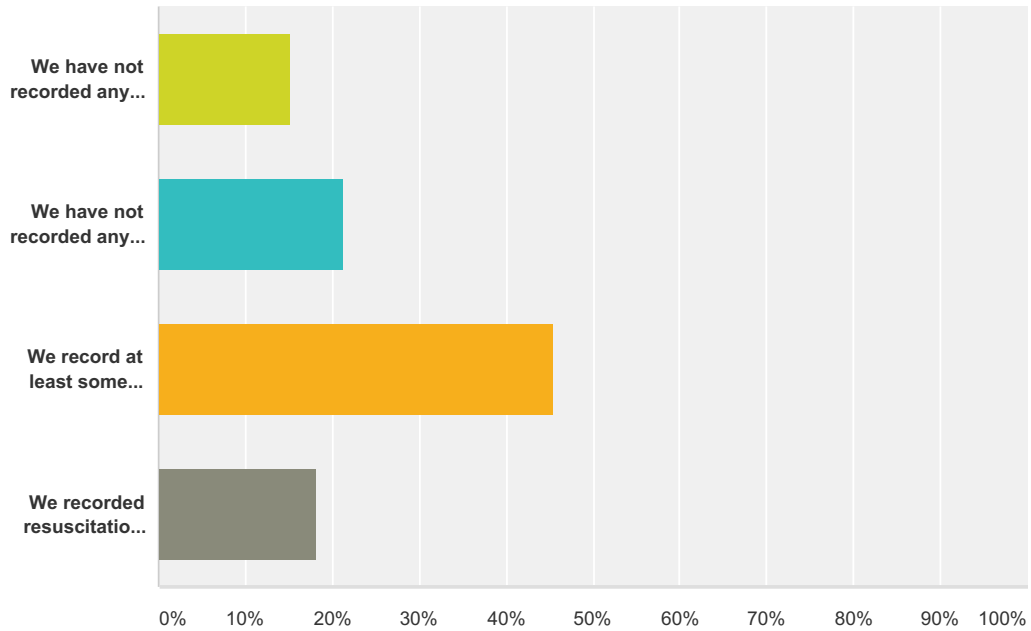

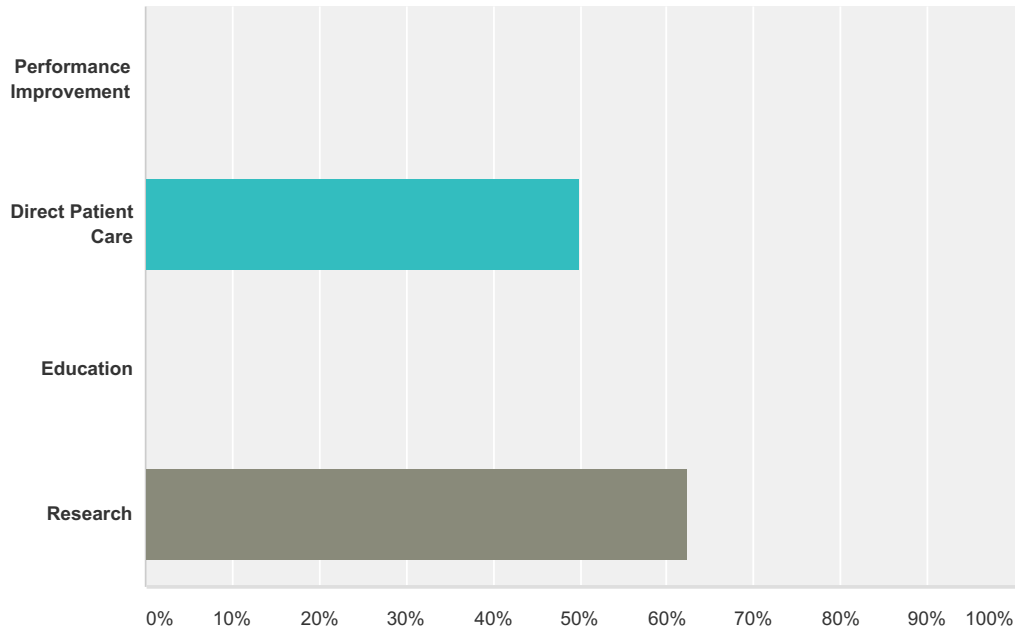

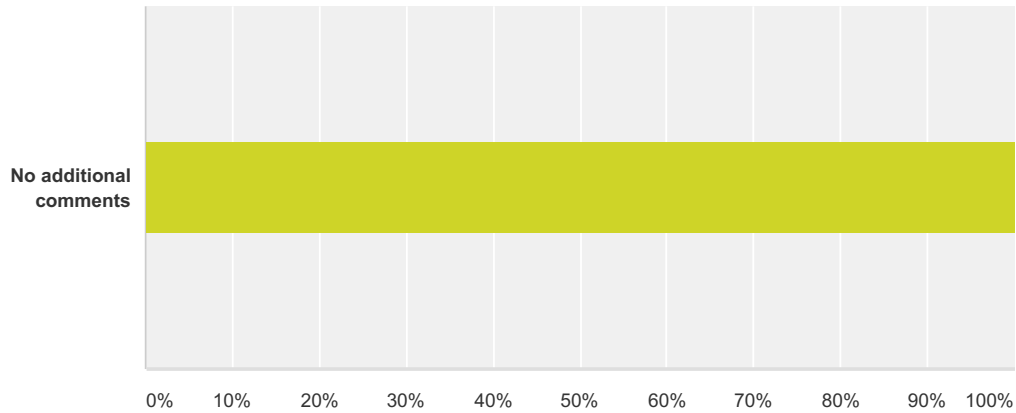
