Surveyor Selection Criteria

Purpose:

To identify criteria for surveyor selection that assures appropriate expertise and supports the Pennsylvania Trauma Systems Foundation (PTSF) conflict of interest policy.

Procedure:

PTSF staff select and assign surveyors for every Consultative Visit, Accreditation Survey, and Panel Review. Effort will be made to develop teams comprised of surveyors from trauma centers that are similar to trauma centers being surveyed.

General Guidelines for Surveyor Selection

- 1. Geographic Restrictions:
 - A. Level I and Level II Trauma Centers: Surveyors must reside and work outside of Pennsylvania.
 - B. Level III Trauma Centers: At least one member of the survey team must work and reside outside of Pennsylvania.
 - C. Level IV Trauma Centers: The survey team may work/reside in Pennsylvania.
- 2. There will be no business or patient care relationship or any potential conflict of interest between the surveyor and/or the surveyor's place of employment and the applicant/applicant healthcare facility being surveyed.
- 3. Surveyors who move out of the state meet eligibility requirements after three years but may not survey hospitals in the competitive market where they had previously worked or lived.
- 4. There is no restriction to the number of times a surveyor may return to re-survey an applicant hospital. This is limited only by an objection of the applicant hospital.

Surveyor Qualifications

- 1. Trauma Surgeons:
 - A. Board Certified (in accordance with PTSF Standards)
 - B. Minimum of five (5) years trauma experience, not including residency
 - C. For the Trauma Surgeon Team Leader: Previous experience as a PTSF surveyor preferred. If this is not possible, previous survey experience with another organization or state is required
 - D. Trauma center experience within the last five (5) years, which may include functioning in a consultative role
- 2. Emergency Medicine and Subspecialists:
 - A. Board Certified (in accordance with PTSF Standards)
 - B. Minimum of five (5) years of subspecialty experience in a trauma center
 - C. Trauma center experience within the last five (5) years, which may include functioning in a consultative role



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3. Registered Nurse:

- A. Trauma Program Management or Trauma Performance Improvement experience
- B. Minimum of three (3) years trauma experience
- C. Clinical experience in ED or ICU preferred
- D. Trauma center experience within the last five (5) years, which may include functioning in a consultative role

Team Composition

Team composition based on trauma center level is noted below. The trauma surgeon will always function as the survey team lead while on site. If a trauma surgeon is not utilized, the EM physician will serve as the team lead.
