
- To develop a process for submitting death reviews to a central site.

- Discuss how audit of the death charts will streamline into the Taxonomy process of death review.



- ► V5 for 2017 XML for 2018.
- The revised timeline for V5 roll out is March to mid 2017
- POPIMS process in the manual
- The committee recommends 90 days to close the death record and submit it to the central site. Is there a technical time limit for submitting records to the POPIMS central site. (DI did confirm that the timeline is two years)

Executive Committee Approvals

- January 1, 2017 will now be the <u>admission date</u> for mortality patients to be submitted to the PTSF POPIMS Central Site
- January 1, 2017 and forward must be submitted
- Mortality submissions will contain all issues associated with the mortality
- Submissions will be required within 90 days of the date of the patient's death
- Mortality submissions will be used by the Outcomes Committee in a blinded manner to identify best practices and support educational efforts
- The POPIMS Central Site will not be used during the accreditation deliberation process
- An educational webinar is being developed by the PTSF

Clarifications:

- Re-opening the case for pertinent additional data such as autopsies or conclusions and resubmission is fine.
- The educational webinar –DI technical <u>"How to Process"</u> for downloading to the central site should be available to the PTSF December 15th, 2017. A link will be sent out to all centers.
