## PTSF COMMITTEE UPDATES AND BOARD ACTIONS

The following items highlight Standards, Trauma Registry, and Policies & Procedure changes approved by the Board of Directors that were moved forward by their respective committees.

#### STANDARDS OF ACCREDITATION COMMITTEE

#### Standard 1: Commitment & Standard 10: Physicians

Level IV trauma centers: Highest/First level activation response time requirements for Emergency Physician and Advanced Practitioners. Compliance expected by January 1, 2021.

- Maximum response time 15 minutes from patient's arrival.
- Additional team members remain at an expected response time of 30 minutes.

#### Standard 6: Performance Improvement & Patient Safety

Added requirements for physicians functioning in the role of a Trauma PI Medical Director/Associate Medical Director. Compliance expected by January 1, 2021.

- This role is optional and these requirements only apply to centers with this role.
- Physicians in this role must be Board Certified in a specialty field and have a job description. They must be included in the PIPS Plan, demonstrate a collaborative working relationship with the TPMD, maintain a CME log with 36 hours/3 years, participate in a TOPIC course within 1 year, and maintain 75% attendance at the multidisciplinary peer review PI meeting and multidisciplinary trauma program operational meeting.

#### Appendix C: Level IV Admission Guidelines

Clarification of recommendations for Level IV trauma programs to consider when developing admission policies for their facility.

- Removed INR < 2 from Neurotrauma, Facial Injury and Truncal Trauma sections.</li>
- Renamed Appendix to "Admission Considerations for Level IV Trauma Centers" to clarify that this
  appendix is a recommendation and not mandatory.

The revised Standards of Accreditation (<u>Adult Level 1, 2 & 3</u>; <u>Pediatric Level 1 & 2</u>; and <u>Adult Level 4</u>) are available on the PTSF web site, dated January 1, 2020 with additional details. #### TRAUMA REGISTRY COMMITTEE UPDATE

The following changes to PTOS/Collector are effective January 1, 2020 unless otherwise noted. The changes are noted in the 2020 PTOS Manual and 2020 Collector software. Changes noted as being effective January 1, 2021, will be reflected in the 2021 PTOS Manual and Collector software updates. Software changes for 2021 admissions are pending based on the timing of the transition to the V5 Collector software.

The 2020 PTOS Manual was available December 20, 2019. During the 2019 Fall Conference, a detailed review of all changes to PTOS/Collector for 2020 admissions occurred. The handouts/slides and audio recording will be posted to the website by the end of January 2020.

- 1. Tourniquet Use—the ability to capture up to four (4) tourniquets placed on a patient and related information will be added to the PTOS dataset and in the 2020 Collector software.
- 2. Vaping and E-Cigarette Use (pre-existing condition)—"Vaping and E-Cigarette Use" will be added to the PTOS dataset as a pre-existing condition for 2020 admissions. E-Cigarette use will be removed from the current "Current Smoker" pre-existing condition definition.
- 3. Clinician Administered—clarification will be added to the "Clinician Administered" data elements in the 2020 PTOS Manual. Record 1, yes if the patient was prescribed medication by a physician. If there is documentation that the patient abused their prescription (i.e. took more than prescribed), record 2, no.
- 4. Advanced EMT (AEMT)—clarification will be added to the "Highest Level Provider" and "Highest Level of Care" data elements in the 2020 PTOS Manual. Record "Advanced" for "Highest Level of Provider" if the provider is an AEMT. "Highest Level of Care" should be abstracted based on the care provided. Note that AEMT's could provide basic and/or limited advanced care.
- 5. End-tidal C02 Monitoring—EtCO2 monitoring will be tentatively added to the PTOS dataset and in the Collector software under the Clinical/Admission Vitals section for 2021 admissions. End-tidal CO2 (EtCO2) monitoring is a noninvasive technique which measures the partial pressure or maximal concentration of carbon dioxide (CO2) at the end of an exhaled breath. EtCO2 is a requirement within the Equipment List of the PTSF Standards of Accreditation.
- 6. Incident Location—data elements to capture incident location will be tentatively added to the PTOS dataset for 2021 admissions. These data elements will match the NTDB incident location elements and definitions.

#### POLICY & PROCEDURE COMMITTEE

Submission of abstracted records for pursuing trauma centers must occur at least monthly to the PTOS central site database starting August 1 of the year prior to the initial site visit. Policy AC-130 – Process for Becoming an Accredited Trauma Center reflects this change. The revised submission requirement is effective immediately.

### AAAM AIS 2015

AlS 2015 is not currently required for compliance and there are no current AlS 2015 compliance deadlines. PTSF will NOT implement AlS 2015 into the PTOS dataset without stakeholder coordination and advanced planning. Please be patient as AlS 2015 requires a technical implementation time period. AAAM just recently released the AlS 2015 technical information to vendors so they may begin their technical product planning. Stay tuned for specific announcements related to implementation of AlS 2015 later in 2020.

However, at this time PTSF recommends registrars begin preparing for the implementation of AIS 2015 by participating in the AAAM AIS 2015 Injury Scaling Course. PTSF plans on offering this course at the 2020 PTSF Fall Conference in October 2020. Please note that students who have recently taken the AIS 2005 Update 2008 course may qualify to take an AIS 2015 special course that focuses on the major updates only. PTSF is also planning on offering this abbreviated update course for those who qualify in 2020. ### COLLECTOR™ Transition to V5 Trauma Registry Software

#### DI Driller®

#### Registry Educational Software

This software is a free tool for the Commonwealth's trauma centers to use to perform interrater reliability effectively and consistently. The software reviews a select number of records and assesses data entry practices for each data element. This new product will be included within the 2020 software package. PTSF staff will provide educational opportunities in conjunction with Digital Innovation, Inc. by ESO throughout 2020.
