### About PTSF

Pennsylvania Trauma Systems Foundation (PTSF) is a non-profit organization authorized by the EMS Act of 1985 as the Accrediting Body for Trauma Centers in Pennsylvania. Our mission is *Optimal Outcomes for Every Injured Patient*. The PTSF accomplishes this mission not just through the hospital accreditation process, but through support and education of trauma program staff including Trauma Program Medical Directors, Trauma Program Managers/Coordinators, Performance Improvement Coordinators, Registrars, Injury Prevention Coordinators, and Researchers. PTSF also encourages trauma system development efforts and collaborates with many community partners including EMS to support initiatives that enhance the care of injured patients. As of January 1, 2026, this includes 64 Trauma Programs at 60 Accredited Trauma Centers and 4 Hospitals Pursuing Accreditation.

### About the Conference

PTSF hosts an annual statewide conference for trauma center staff to share current trends in trauma care, present cutting-edge trauma research, and promote networking among trauma program leaders. Annual highlights of the conference include the John Pryor Memorial Trauma Lecture and three trauma research competitions. In 2025, over 250 conference registrants attended the conference.
